MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE

Watching and Waiting for God.

In the last few weeks with the cold weather I have been longing for summer. How long will it be until it gets above 60 degrees again? I considered having a countdown of days until I remembered that I am not great with math plus I am sure it would make the winter seem longer if I started counting the days.

As we lean toward Christmas, it's helpful to remember that the people of Israel were waiting for a messiah for over 900 years. The prophets, especially Isaiah, spoke God's promises of a coming deliverer. Many of those years waiting were spent in a foreign country far from home.

SHARING TREE 2018 - FOR HOMELESS YOUTH

Altar Committee will be sponsoring the LINK Program for Homeless Youth this upcoming holiday season. The program is sponsored through Lutheran Social Services. On any given night, 60 to 100 youth are experiencing homelessness in the Rochester and Southeastern Minnesota area. Since 2012, LSS has served youth who are, or are at risk of, experiencing homelessness through the Living Independently with Knowledge (LINK) program. The LINK program provides a safe environment where youth ages 16-24 can receive nonjudgmental assistance from caring and trustworthy adults who are knowledgeable in overcoming the barriers of homelessness.

LINK offers a wide range of services, training and tools to support youth in becoming productive, healthy and independent adults. They assist young people in meeting basic needs by providing food, clothing and information on how to access short-term shelter.

Support is tailored to fit each person's needs and can include case management, life-skills classes, host homes for youth, transitional housing services, and peer support group activities and employment support. Financial assistance for rent and/or a rental deposit may also be available for youth who meet eligibility requirements.

CHANCEL CHOIR

Chancel Choir is trying something new this year. Our goal is to encourage participation in the choir by decreasing the singers' time commitment. CHARITABLE GIVING AFTER AGE 70 1/2

Individuals age 70 ½ and older may distribute up to \$100,000 tax-free each year from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) to certain charitable organizations without including the amount of the charitable distribution in gross income when filing their tax return. The entire distribution must otherwise be deductible as a charitable contribution.

Why does this provision in the Internal Revenue Tax Code take on more importance in 2018?

The recent income tax act passed by Congress increases the standard deduction for individuals to \$12,000 and to \$24,000 for married couples (\$26,500 for couples who are both over age 65).

It is estimated that only 15% of federal tax returns filed for 2018 will itemize deductions.

The provision referenced in the first paragraph will allow taxpayers who have reached age 70 ½ to direct the custodian of their IRA account to make a direct distribution from their account to a designated charity. This results in reported taxable income being reduced to the extent of the charitable distribution and achieving a result similar to prior years when they would have itemized deductions.

An added benefit is this method of giving also reduces gross income for the calculation determining the amount of Social Security benefits that may be taxable.

**2019 YOUTH MISSION TRIP
BENTON HARBOR, MI - JULY 28 – AUGUST 2, 2019**

About Benton Harbor - Southwest Michigan is an area with miles of scenic shoreline. Benton Harbor is a “twin city” to St. Joseph. The racially and economically disparate towns are divided by the St. Joseph River. During a week in Benton Harbor, your group will partner with local organizations to serve the city’s youngest and oldest residents. You’ll also assist with yard work and paint homes. In the evenings, your group will tour the community and learn about the fine arts revitalization, experience local BBQ, visit a Lake Michigan beach, and explore Benton Harbor’s sister city, St. Joseph. Also enjoy a visit with a local music group that provides a positive outlet to youth in the community.

Registration for Benton Harbor – Christ Lutheran has reserved 15 spots for the mission trip (13 youth & 2 adult chaperones). To register, please submit a registration form along with the \$125 down payment by December 2, 2018. Space is limited so priority will be based on when checks are received. With fundraisers, our goal is to keep the cost to a maximum \$250 out of pocket, per youth. Students attending should assist with the Youth Committee sponsored fundraisers such as Cabin Fever Babysitting, Palm Sunday French Toast Breakfast, and the Solstice Stomp 5K. The mission trip is open to youth that completed 8th thru 12th grade by June of 2019.
