#### **A**LTAR

Altar Committee Annual Report 2018

We change the banners, paraments; put names on the baptismal and funeral banners. We maintain the acolyte robes; laundering and making repairs as needed. #### **BUILDING & GROUNDS**

Christ Lutheran Church building and grounds committee was busy in 2018 keeping the building in good working condition. The Building and Grounds Committee worked on the following projects this year:

- Service Master shampooed all carpeted floors in the building. The building and grounds crew organized the cleaning and ensured all carpeted surfaces were cleared and after the cleaning all carpeted areas had items returned back to their previous layout.
- Repaired sanctuary windows that were starting to rot.
- Built closet shelf organizer systems in the fellowship hall closets.
- Replaced drinking fountain by the Sunday school rooms.
- Repainted and updated multi-purpose room next to the kitchen.
- Spring and Fall clean up days. Trimmed trees. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped out.

Roof taskforce committee has been formed to lead the roof project.

Our future holds some major repairs that are as follows:

- One of two HVAC units for the sanctuary is being replaced this spring; it is not safe
  to use. The other unit needs to be replaced within the next couple years. Cost for
  each is about \$15,000.
- Carpet needs to be replaced in some of the Sunday school rooms.
- Repaint the music room.

- Install lighting in the fellowship hall closets.
- The East emergency glass door, in the education wing, should be updated. This would provide energy savings and add to our building security.
- The north education wing furnace has never had an A/C unit installed and we
  continue to have mold and moisture problems every summer, which adds to the
  cleanup every fall before we start Sunday school.
- Would like to standardize all thermostats to WIFI programmable models that can send a message when the temperature goes above or below set points which means one of the seven furnaces has failed to operate.
- Upgrade the parking lot and exterior lighting to LED, (completed 1/15/2019) with the addition of an atomic clock timer. The current clock timer has failed several times.
- The women's restroom should be updated to try and match the men's restroom we updated two years ago.
- Continue to work on the second service projection system and mounted the display television that was started in 2016. We still have brackets to install in 2019 to mount the big screen in the sanctuary.

The building and grounds committee works hard and diligently behind the scenes to keep the building ready for serving the parishioners and the community members who use Christ Lutheran Church year round. A special thanks to all who have donated money and/or time to ensure projects are completed.

#### **EDUCATION**

**Education Committee 2018 Annual Report** 

River of Life (ROL) Sunday School for ages 3 year olds to 6th grade was conducted from 9:05 to 9:55 in between church services. There are 141 children enrolled in the ROL program. The Sunday School curriculum chosen was called "Digging into Discipleship" by Group Publishing. Each Sunday the participants learn about a different Bible lesson.

ROL has been blessed by many volunteers. Each class has team teaching or 2-4 parents who have volunteered to teach and about 1 student helper per class. There are 28 adults who have volunteered to teach and/or help with ROL this fall. Kaia Long has led music opening for 3 year olds through 2nd graders. The older groups meet in their classrooms right away, and those who wish to be involved in choir joined the group led by MarJean Damerval that meets on Wednesday nights at 6:00 pm. A big "Thank you" goes to all the volunteers who give of their time and talents to make Christ known to children at CLC!

With the help of both pastors and others, a Sunday morning Adult Education option has taken place since Rally Sunday. "Christianity Explored" was the first resource in the fall. After Christmas, there will be "Bible Talk" for congregation members who are interested in learning about what they are reading in the Bible. Articles on different subjects will also be discussed during this time.

Thirty 3rd – 6th graders attended the "Snow Much Fun" Lock In on March 2nd & 3rd. Ice Breakers, games, and a Bible lesson was organized by the members of the committee. A large breakfast was served the following morning. There will be a ROL family retreat to do some sledding at Ironwood Spring in place of "Snow Much Fun" this year. Vacation Bible School - VBS was held at CLC on July 30th to August 2nd. Counselors from Shetek Lutheran Ministries (Slayton, MN) led a Day Camp from 8am-12:30pm. The theme was "Water of Life". Bible Study, games, snacks, and praise & worship time occupied this time for spiritual growth for the 31 kids in attendance. There was also a concert/performance for parents and others on Wednesday night that week. Many people volunteered their time to teach, help with crafts, games, and serve snacks to the children.

This fall the 3rd graders received their own bibles from CLC during the worship service, and in November, the 5th graders received 1st communion. The 5th graders had 4 weeks of lessons about communion during ROL prior to receiving 1st communion. All the participants also made the communion bread for the service and made a project that reflected what communion means to them. The student projects were displayed in the narthex.

On December 9th, the Children's Christmas program was conducted during the 10 AM worship service. The 3 year olds through 6th graders presented the musical "Sing a Song of Christmas". A huge number of children participated by singing, speaking, reading, ringing bells, and dressing up as the main players in the Nativity.

Confirmation has been running smoothly in 2018. Many of the major responsibilities have been split amongst the confirmation leaders. There were 15 students confirmed last spring. This year, there are 18 7th graders and 13 8th graders participating in the confirmation program. Pastor Steve and Pastor Nirmala have been using the "Here We Stand" curriculum for lessons each week. The students meet with Pastor Steve or Pastor Nirmala for lessons and then have time with their mentors each week. The students are also assigned a single sheet back to back and a bible reading to do as homework before

each class. Each class also does service projects and sermon notes. The calendar, service project sign ups, and communication with confirmation students and their parents is web-based. The families are easily able to stay informed and/or sign up for events through the confirmation web links. Confirmation students helped with preparing, serving and cleanup of the Lenten Soup meals in 2018.

# FAMILY PROMISE NETWORK (IHN)

The Family Promise program (formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network) continues at Christ Lutheran. We have been part of this program for many years. As a host site we provide housing, evening meals, transportation drivers, and hosts while families are present in the church building. The need for this program continues year in and year out. We are part of a large group of over forty faith communities that support the program in the greater Rochester area. We appreciate the help of about forty active volunteers in the program including support from volunteers from Byron United Methodist, East St. Olaf Lutheran, and Devoted Hearts (a home school group in Pine Island). Excellent information on the Rochester Area Family Promise program is available on the website www.familypromiserochester.org. The Family Promise program nationally has been in place for twenty five years. The program in Rochester started in 1999. Family Promise Rochester also manages more permanent housing for families in need through about five homes and apartments as they transition from homelessness to more stable living situations. The families are provided financial counseling, parenting skills assistance, nutrition guidance, and help with furniture and household items to get back on their feet. Our program at Christ Lutheran can always use more volunteers. The role of coordinators would be much easier if a larger number of people were available to ask each host week. We can always use more van drivers (about 60 to 90 minutes each day). More overnight hosts are needed as well (about 12 hours commitment). Meal hosts provide meals each evening (about 3 hours plus meal preparation time). New volunteers need to attend a 60 minute training session. Our goal is to have enough volunteers that each person would be asked to help twice a year. As always, please feel free to contact any program coordinator with questions on how to become an active volunteer and help with the IHN program. This wonderful mission program is a way to assist families in

need. Giving of your time and talents is very rewarding. We agree completely with the simple statement of purpose of the Family Promise IHN program. "Building Communities, Strengthening Lives."
