

### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STEVE**

Advent begins November 29 and is about Christ's first coming and his second coming. The people of God were waiting for deliverance, waiting for the promised Messiah. For 4 centuries they waited for a word from God and for a deliverer. Then the angels came to announce the coming messiah to Mary and Joseph and the shepherds.

This past year has been a season for waiting for us. Waiting for relief from covid. Waiting for the results of an election. Waiting for a vaccine. Waiting to see friends and family. Waiting for normalcy to return. A year is a long time to wait. We can begin to empathize with what it would mean to wait for centuries for a deliverer.

Christmas, Good Friday, Easter and Pentecost are amazing historical events when God intervened to open the door for us to live for Him and with Him forever as His beloved children. God cared enough to come and save us. God is with us!

### Mission Trip - Pine Ridge, SD, June 20-25, 2021 - Register by December

Christ Lutheran has reserved 15 spots for the mission trip (13 youth & 2 adult chaperones). To register, please submit a registration form located on the kiosk or at: <a href="http://www.clcbyron.org/wp-content/">http://www.clcbyron.org/wp-content/</a> uploads/2020/08/2021-Youth-Mission-Trip-Registration-Form.pdf</a> along with the \$125 down payment by December 2020. Space is limited so priority will be based on when checks are received. With fundraisers, our goal is to keep the cost to a maximum \$250 out of pocket, per youth. The total cost of mission trips is around \$6,000 with about \$3,000 covered by the families. Students attending should assist with the Youth Committee sponsored fundraisers such as Cabin Fever Babysitting, Shareholder Dinner, Palm Sunday French Toast Breakfast, and the Solstice Stomp 5K. The mission trip is open to youth that complete 8th thru 12th grade by June of 2021. This year only: since last year's mission trips were cancelled, YouthWorks is allowing last year seniors to attend next summer.

### CHARITABLE GIVING AFTER AGE 70 1/2

Individuals age 70 ½ and older may distribute up to \$100,000 tax-free each year from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) to certain charitable organizations without including the amount of the charitable distribution in gross income when filing their tax return. The entire distribution must otherwise be deductible as a charitable contribution.

The provision referenced in the above paragraph will allow taxpayers who have reached age 70 ½ to direct the custodian of their IRA account to make a direct distribution from their account to a designated charity. This results in reported taxable income being reduced to the extent of the charitable distribution and achieving a result similar to prior years when they would have itemized deductions. An added benefit is this method of giving also reduces gross income for the calculation determining the amount of Social Security benefits that may be taxable. Contact Irv Nehring with questions.

### **FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE**

The Family Promise (FP) program as we know it has been severely affected by the Covid 19 pandemic. The hosting in churches ended in March when the virus surfaced and almost everything about our lives and routines changed. The need for the program continued however. Initially the guests were housed at the old Bible College campus. The families did not need overnight supervision and meals were dropped off with no face to face contact. But housing the guests was quite expensive and the normal counseling that takes place to try and have guests make life style changes that increase the likelihood that changing financial and personal decisions that could lead to a better outcome was difficult. Not many of us thought the Covid virus would still be affecting our lives. The FP program continued to assist families in need as they could.

The leadership of FP has been looking at how the program is structured for a long time. The current day center house is old and has been a "get by" facility for many years. The Covid 19 distancing requirements could not be met there. FP Rochester decided to take the bold decision to purchase a new facility that provided the opportunity for families to be able to safely distance and have rooms to sleep in as well. (Family Promise Eau Claire, WI has used this model successfully for several years) That means that churches will no longer be used to provide sleeping quarters. Faith communities and other groups will still be needed to provide overnight oversight as well as meals. At CLC and when Byron United Methodist Church was the host site the meal providers also served as evening hosts for the families. The overnight hosts came in about 8 PM. Drivers were provided during the morning and afternoon to take guests to the day center and back to our host church. The Covid 19 concerns means no face to face contact for meal providers as we have done in the past.

The new structure will not need drivers but most likely will need an evening host from about 5 to 8 PM. Because many volunteers are older (especially overnight hosts) and since the Covid 19 issues are still major priorities, FP leaders have decided not to have churches commit to providing volunteers for a week commitment but rather have the entire volunteer base signup to provide meals, evening hosts, and overnight hosts. The FP programs plans to start taking in families in need the first week of January 2021. By July 2021 congregations may be asked to commit to a week of volunteers, but no decision has been made on that matter.

U.S. 14 Corridor Analysis Online Open House is Dec. 3 The public is invited to participate in an online open house meeting for the US 14 Corridor Analysis Project at 5:30 p.m., Dec. 3. Olmsted County and its partners at the Minnesota Department of Transportation, the cities of Byron and Kasson, and Dodge County are developing a long-term vision and implementation plan for US 14 between Kasson, Byron, and Rochester from Highway 57 (Mantorville Avenue) to Olmsted County Road 104 (60th Avenue). Those who are available to attend the online open house will have the opportunity to hear from and talk with the project team, review the selected long-term vision for the corridor, learn about potential implementation plans and next steps, as well as share feedback on information presented during the meeting.
