



## LENTEN SERIES 2021 - FREEDOM IN CHRIST

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 17. There will not be ashes, but there will be stickers with the sign of the cross for your forehead if you so desire. Each person or family will put their stickers on their forehead. Due to COVID-19 there will be no soup suppers this year. Services are at 6:30 February 17 through March 24. Services will be in person, in parking lot FM and online. Confirmants are required to be at Wednesday worship and attend small group following. Contact your mentors if for some reason you will be doing Lent or virtual small group online.

**Freedom in Christ** is our Lenten series this year based on the Apostle Paul's letter to the Galatians. We are picking up where we left off last season's Lent. Paul reminded the community of believers in Galatia that they were saved through faith alone. There were false teachers saying that faith in Christ was not enough. The Apostle Paul jealously guards the Gospel. Through focusing on this teaching letter, our hope is that you remember that you can't "add" to the gospel without taking away from the freedom that God has for you in Jesus. The pastors, along with members of Christ Lutheran will teach the messages. We will be using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy. You are encouraged to read Galatians in preparation to more fully appreciate the Gospel that sets us free in Christ.

## MISSION TRIP - TOTALLY NEW TRIP AND DATES!!

**JUNE 13-18, 2021 - KANSAS CITY, MO**

Due to COVID, our mission trip to a South Dakota reservation in June was cancelled by YouthWorks. Our new location is Kansas City, MO from June 13-18, 2021. We still have 15 spots reserved (13 youth and 2 adult chaperones). Seven of the student spots have been filled and 6 remain open. To register, please submit a registration form located on the kiosk or at: <http://www.clcbyron.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/08/2021-Youth-Mission-Trip-Registration-Form.pdf> along with the \$125 down payment or the full \$250 payment. This year only: since last year's mission trips were cancelled, YouthWorks is allowing last year seniors to attend next summer.

Please register by March 1 to guarantee your spot. Spots are reserved by the order the checks are received. We are exploring the option of opening up the trip to non-CLC Youth, if spots remain unfilled. New this year, due to COVID, we can release unused spots back without financial penalty, up until May 1.

The total cost of mission trips is around \$6,000 with about \$3,000 covered by the families and \$3,000 raised through fundraising throughout the year.

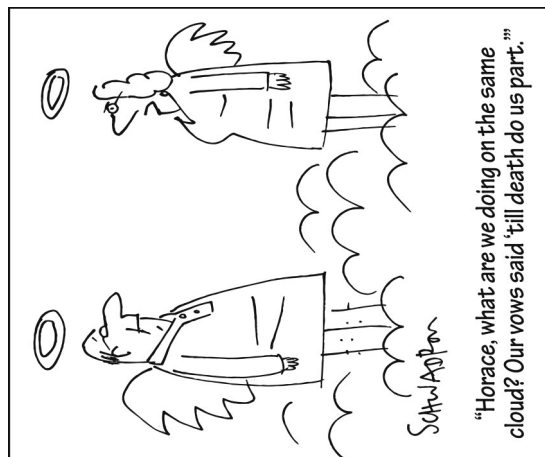
