A motion to approve the agenda was made by Joan Skare and seconded by Ben Johnson. Motion passed.

A motion to approve the minutes was made by Joe Biewer and seconded by Kaia Long. Motion passed.

A discussion was held on our Coffee Hour and changes that could be made to improve attendance. More information will be coming on that.

Work is currently being done on the church website. One of the things we need is the ability to post committee notes there.

Jason Pfeilsticker presented the Treasurer's report. February 2022 ended \$4,072.43 in the red. Expense exceeds income for the year by \$9,271.36.

The shingles on our roof could not be matched. Therefore, our insurance company will pay for the full replacement. The job will be scheduled as soon as possible. We will need to pay for the replacement of the flat roof. There is currently a shortage of flat roof materials, so it is not known when that will be done.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Jason Pfeilsticker and seconded by Joan Skare. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be April 19th, 2022.

Currently approximately \$70,000 has been set aside in the roof fund to cover the flat roof and expenses on shingling that may not be covered by insurance such as permits, decking and improvements on venting the fellowship hall roof. Thanks to everyone who has donated to the roof fund. The tarps will be replaced by a better temporary patch before the real fix which may come in June or July. We have two contractors, Above All for shingles and Tri State for the flat roof. The shingles will be done first.
