
SUMMER TIME CHANGES

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Mark Turany.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Joe Biewer and seconded by Ben Johnson.

A motion to approve the minutes was made by Joan Skare and seconded by Jason Pfeilsticker.

Jason Pfeilsticker submitted the Treasurer's report. March 2022 ended \$6,502.77 in the red. Expense exceeds income for the year by \$15,774.08.

Pastor Steve gave an update on the web site progress. Committee minutes are updated and more user friendly.

Jason gave an update on the roof progress. We have secured Above All Roofing to replace the shingles. Insurance check has been received. We have secured Tri-State Commercial Roofing to replace the flat roof after the shingles are replaced. This project is expected to begin in June or July, 2022.

Ben gave an update on the city of Byron sewer work to be completed late summer. The city has asked to use CLC property to store some construction equipment to complete their project near highway 14. The council deemed this to be a reasonable request and granted permission via paper approval form per city request.

There was discussion surrounding planning and ideas to encourage members and nonmembers to return to church and fellowship.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Joan Skare and seconded by Jason Pfeilsticker. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

ROOF UPDATES - Our

insurance company will pay for replacement of shingles. We have an estimate for the flat roof for 50,000. Currently approximately \$70,000 has been set aside in the roof fund to cover the flat roof and expenses on shingling that may not be covered by insurance such as permits, decking and improvements on venting the fellowship hall roof. Thanks to everyone who has donated to the roof fund. The tarps will be replaced by a better temporary patch before the real fix which may come in June or July. We have two contractors, Above All for shingles and Tri State for the flat roof. The shingles will be done first.
