The CLC council meeting was held on October 18, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Mark Turany.

Members present: Pastor Steve Rheingans, Mark Turany, Joe Biewer, Jason Pfeilsticker, Ben Johnson, Dave Schlobohm, Anna Palmer and Linda Danielski. Members not present: Joan Skare, Candee Ostreng, Naomi Meek and Allie Petersen.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Joe Biewer and seconded by Ben Johnson.

Jason Pfeilsticker presented the treasurer's report. September 2022 ended \$15,043.61 in the black. Income exceeds expenses for the year by \$1603.40.

Pastor Rheingans gave us an update on the lighting that needs to be done in the sanctuary.

Discussions were also held on the Boy Scouts using our facility for meetings as well as the possible replacement of the East door.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Linda Danielski and seconded by Jason Pfeilsticker.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DONA-

TIONS - After age 70 1/2 and older, individuals may distribute up to \$100,000 taxfree each year from their IRAs to certain charitable organizations without including the amount of the charitable distribution in gross income when filing tax returns. An added benefit is this method of giving also reduces gross income for the calculation determining the amount of Social Security benefits that may be taxable.

EMPLOYEE RETENTION CREDIT - Christ Lutheran Church applied for the Employee Retention Credit that is part of the CARES Act. Christ Lutheran contracted Congregation Consulting Services to complete our submission at a cost of \$1,500. We were able to receive \$20,453.67, which nets to \$18,953.67. These funds have been applied to the general fund. Without these funds, Expenses would exceed Income by \$17,235.69 on the year.
