

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

I encourage you to attend the annual meeting where we elect our leaders, discuss our life together and our hopes and priorities for our congregation. If you don't make it I would like to thank you for your participation in Christ Lutheran's mission. Annual reports are available in the narthex, or in the kiosk, or online. There are probably more details than you want to know, but collectively we are tending to our mission to make Christ's love known by equipping all ages to love and serve God.

Wherever I find myself serving with God's people I keep reminding myself to keep the main thing, the main thing. I return often to the great commission and the great commandment given by Jesus.

Matthew 28:16-20 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

Authorized by Jesus and knowing that He is present with us until the end, we press on together to baptize and make disciples. When Jesus was asked what was the most important commandment He said: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Making disciples who grow in love for God and neighbor is our primary task as the people of God following Christ in God's mission. Together, let's stay focused on what is most important.

Lent begins February 22 with Ash Wednesday with communion and optional imposition of ashes. The readings in Lent head towards the cross, which was the reason Jesus came, to be our savior. I am looking forward to hearing "Stories of Faith" as told by our congregational members.
