Phase One: The Leave-taking - The Transition time

After the pastor announces they are resigning their call, a representative from the Office of the Bishop will meet with the congregational council to orient them to the call process (occurred Feb 22). At this time, information about the interim pastor is shared with the council so they can make the best decision about how the congregation and ministries will be cared for.... It is also the time to celebrate the ministry that

the pastor and the congregation have shared and the council forms and appoints the call committee.

Pastor Nirmala's call is not presently affected by Pastor Steve's retirement.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DONATIONS


