

PASTOR'S MESSAGE - MAY

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Our Easter celebration continues. Easter is more than one day, it is the season of unbounded hope, joy, awe, and wonder. Proclaiming "Christ is risen, he is risen, indeed", always reminds us that the worst thing is never the last thing, because God acts beyond our expectations and human understanding.

Living by faith, we are an "Easter people", because we always view the world as full of possibility, that things are not always what they seem, and that God can make a way out of what appears to be "no way". Easter reframes our hope and our fear, for in Jesus, we see that God is always working to bring life, even out of death.

Because the first Easter, or appearance of the risen Christ, occurred on the first day of the week, it was decided at the Council of Nicea, in 325 AD, that Christians should celebrate His resurrection, and worship, on the first day of the week. For Christians, all of life is understood through the lens of God's decisive action to overcome sin, evil and death with the power of self-giving love and new life.

On the first Easter evening, the risen Jesus appears to his fearful disciples, who were hiding behind closed doors. The first thing he says to them is, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." There was much they didn't understand. They were deeply afraid, and Jesus understood this. Still, he wants them

(and us) to trust that nothing they (or we) fear is greater than God's ability to transform it. No one, and nothing, can separate us from his love and presence.

Now, we see everything, and everyone, in a new way. We find courage and strength for each day. We are sent, to share this new reality, so that others might also embrace the amazing good news that there is a truer way of being, knowing, and responding, which is Christ, himself, who makes all things new. Alleluia!
