### 1 Thessalonians 5:11-18

<sup>11</sup> Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. <sup>12</sup> Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. <sup>13</sup> Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. <sup>14</sup> And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. <sup>15</sup> Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. <sup>16</sup> Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup> pray continually, <sup>18</sup> give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

### **Greetings Christ Lutheran!**

Introductions: We each gave a brief introduction of ourselves to Pr Jeremy Johnson and he did as well.

This relates to Ecclesiastes 3:1 which states "To everything there is a season and a time to every purpose under heaven"...

J Biewer reminded us of the garage sale at CLC which will take place on July 25-26. J Brooks is chairing this event. Set up and drop off will be July 22-23 after 5:00 pm.

Pr Jeremy Johnson will start on July 1. His first service will be July 6. His installation date will be July 27, with Pastor Barb Streed, assistant to the Bishop, in attendance. There will be a welcome reception after the service. The service on Sunday, June 29 will be led by Pr Judy. J Biewer will thank the call comm. during that service.

Christopher and Taylor Hill were received into membership of Christ Lutheran Church by affirmation of faith. Motion was made by J Pfeilsticker and seconded by L Brown to approve this. Motion passed.

Motion was made by R Holz to change the name on the CLC debit card to Pastor Jeremy Johnson and remove J Biewer, effective July 1. L Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed.
